

## Options for 310 workshop

1. Love your process. Learn how to navigate difficult decisions using the law and your local rules.  
\*Starting with a complete application, knowing time frames, decision-making criteria, and how to make a sound decision. How are teams involved in decision-making, and what decisions does the board make on applications. Timeframes to keep in mind. What is a precedent? What does it mean to table an application? Does the CD have the duty to act? Permit timelines.
2. Jurisdiction. Where does it begin and end? What are the important definitions in determining jurisdiction? What is a "project and what is not?
3. Complaints, violations, and penalties. What is against the law? What is the CD's role in handling complaints? What penalties can be levied and what is the process? What is a valid complaint? Who is responsible – the applicant? Contractor? Other?
4. Important 310 court cases and what they mean for 310 administration?
5. Can a CD prohibit certain types of projects? What are options for addressing cumulative affects of certain projects?
6. Annual plans of work and maintenance permits.
7. What is an emergency and what process does the board follow for emergencies??
8. What is the role of the team? What is FWP's role?
9. What role does the public have in the administration of the 310 law? What are the requirements for notice? What information should be available to the public?
10. Landowner permission for a project, and landowner permission for inspections.
11. Modifying applications – the process and what to avoid.
12. Dispute resolution – formal versus informal.
13. A general discussion of options for seeking agreement on the importance of woody debris versus and the inherent risks of recreation?
